

McEvoy Ranch Tasting Evening

We packed a full house for the June installment of our Tasting Series with Shannon Frances from McEvoy Ranch.

We learned the fascinating history of the late Nan McEvoy and her trailblazing efforts with the Washington Post, her involvement in founding the Peace Corp and Planned Parenthood. Nan founded the ranch in late 1980's, originally as a family retreat.

Shannon also spoke of Nan's challenges when deciding to plant olives on her 550-acre dairy farm, and how they became one of the preeminent leaders in certified organic, extra virgin olive oil. McEvoy Ranch is now the favorite and often preferred oil among professional chefs and home cooks that favor the farm-to-table approach. For our tasting, we incorporated McEvoy's pre-packed food products to create some unique small bites for members to enjoy during their wine tasting.

Our tasting included:

Popcorn with Jalapeño Olive Oil and Fleur de Sel, and Tuscan Olives for the tables

Rosé with Deconstructed Bay Shrimp Vietnamese Spring Roll with Spicy Sweet Pepper Jam

White Rhône Blend with Crostini with Artichoke Lemon Bruschetta with Lemon Olive Oil and Parmesan Cheese

Estate Pinot Noir with Wild Mushroom and Thyme Leaf Tartlets with Ricotta and Black Olive Tapenade

Petaluma Gap Cabernet Sauvignon with a Chocolate Olive Oil Cookie

Chocolate Olive Oil Cookies

Adapted from The Olive Harvest Cookbook

Makes about 40 cookies

These delightfully, bittersweet chocolate cookies pair perfectly with that after-dinner cup of coffee, of if you'd prefer to keep the evening going, enjoy them with a silky, velvety Cabernet Sauvignon.

- 1 2/3 cups unbleached AP flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/2 teas. baking soda
- 1/4 teas. ground cinnamon
- 3/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1 teas. good vanilla extract
- 1/4 teas. almond extract
- 3 oz. bittersweet chocolate, melted and cooled to lukewarm
- 1. Preheat oven to 350°f. Line 2 large baking sheets with parchment or silicone baking sheets.
- 2. Sift flour, sugar, cocoa powder, baking soda and cinnamon into a medium sized bowl. In a separate bowl, whisk together olive oil and vanilla and almond extracts, then add to the dry ingredients. Add the melted chocolate and stir with a wooden spoon until mixture comes together into a uniform mass and ingredients are fully incorporated. Using your hands, roll the dough into balls 3/4 to 1 inch in diameter and place them on prepared baking sheet, spacing them 2 inches apart.
- 3. Bake the cookies I sheet at a time until cooked through and very lightly browned, about 15 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack and let cool completely. Store in an airtight container at room temperature for up to 3 days.


Well that's what I was told .. and I'm sticking with it!



From Tom's Galley Sautéed Red Shrimp with Smoked Trout and Clam Linguine



This is an easy, one skillet dinner with great flavor. The secret ingredient is the smoked trout fillets that add a hint of smoke to the shrimp. The honey mustard balances out the flavors while adding a subtle sweet mustard flavor. This recipe was created while I was shopping at Trader Joe's. I bought the Argentinian Red Shrimp to try them, and then saw the Clam Linguine and my mind started working. Let me know what you think.

Ingredients:

- ♣ 1-tablespoon butter
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- ♣ 1 red onion
- 1 16-ounce package Trader Joe's Argentinian Red Shrimp, thawed
- 1 16-ounce package Trader Joe's Linguine with Clam Sauce
- ≟ 1-½ tablespoons honey mustard
- 1 3.9-ounce tin Trader Joe's Smoked Trout fillets

Method:

Melt butter in a skillet over medium heat.

Add garlic and diced red onion and cook until onions are tender.

Increase heat to high; add shrimp and cook, tossing to coat, until just opaque, about 2 minutes.

Transfer to a bowl and set aside.

In the same skillet add 2 tablespoons water and the frozen linguine and cover.

Cover and cook to package instructions.

When linguine is cooked, reduce heat to medium add 1 ½ tablespoons honey mustard and mix with pasta.

Add smoked trout fillets, broken into small pieces, stir.

Add shrimp to pasta and heat through and serve.

Serves 4

These recipes have been created and developed by PYC member, Staff Commodore and chef Tom Griffith and are designed to be prepared on board your boat, using only two burners or a BBQ. They can also be prepared at home for any family dinner.



2019 Delta Cruise Instructions

- Devil's Isle July 20 21
- Delta Yacht Club July 22 July 26

My goal is to leave by 10:00 am each morning for our cruising though sailboats may have to maintain a different schedule. We will conduct a Skipper's Meeting at 4PM the day before we depart to a new location. Depart times and other deviations from our general plan will be decided as a group. Generators run times can be altered based on needs. 8 am to 10 pm is usually a good guideline for use.

When coming into The Cove come up on Channel 68 so we can have you raft up accordingly. Generally speaking the boats already rafted up will have their fenders set up already. Have your fenders set ahead of time. We will either have you come in and drop anchor or depending on the situation I can grab your anchor with my inflatable after you are tied up to the raft up and drop it. Have a stern anchor with you as this is a necessary evil to have. Dogs can be taken by inflatable to West Gate which is nearby and quick to get to with ample areas to do their thing.

Devil's Isle will be a coordinated effort for docking. Dan Borges, from Devil's Isle/Oxbow Yacht Club, will be coordinating this effort. I would like one boat to come in and dock at a time for safety reasons. Come up on your marine radio (Ch 68) if you are not with the group traveling from "The Cove". Devil's Isle is a stern tie! Please have your lines and fenders ready

prior to backing in. Folks will be on the docks ready to grab your lines. Have your lines attached to your cleats ahead of time. When docking we leave a little room between the boats so the boats do not touch. The rules for Devil's Isle address some of the docking. Once again please RSVP for Devils Isle with a check for your dock fees and dinner if desired. This weekend also serves as a fund raiser for Oxbow Yacht Club. This will be a fun party. There is a nice and safe area to swim with cover provided that is unaffected by current for our littles on the trip. There is also a designated area for the dogs to go pottie! Please handle your own garbage as much as possible. I will do a trash run on our last morning.

Delta Yacht Club does not accept any arrivals until 11:00 am or so on day 1. With that said I will have one boat dock at a time for safety reasons once again. We will proceed in one boat at a time in an orderly fashion on channel 68. I will coordinate the communications on the radio to bring you all in! I would advise staging in the main channel near Delta Yacht Club until you are all called in! They do not allow any alcohol to be consumed after they ring the bell in the bar to open it which usually happens around 4:00 pm. Please do not leave any dirty dishes in their kitchen! When you are done with a dish wash it immediately. I want to avoid the lecture this year from our hosts on that one. On Weds night we will do a giant pot lock. Folks generally bring hors d'oeuvres to share every night at cocktail hour. They have a full kitchen and barbecues available for our use! Ice is also available. Last year I was told to have all of our swim ladders down for safety reasons. We should have enough room to park our toys in the inside near the entrance. Our dogs have to go potty in the designated areas outside of the little golf course. Bring a few clubs like a Pitching wedge, putter, and maybe a 9 iron. Please refer to the rules for additional details. I will collect the fees on Thursday in the afternoon. We all generally leave a \$20.00 dollar tip for Moises, the island caretaker. We love him!

Don't forget the pre-cruise planning party on June 30th.
