
Our houseboat vacation goes down in our history books as a wonderful summer trip as boaters, grand parents & teenage girls.

From Tom's Galley Chicken, Shrimp, and Kielbasa paella



The flavors of the sausage, shrimp and chicken combined with the herbs and vegetables provide layers of flavor that seems to change with every bite. Be sure to use a medium grain rice as this adds the texture to the dish. Most rice is a long grain, which is the fluffy rice when cooked. A medium grain rice is more like the Chinese rice but not quite as sticky. This holds the flavors together in the final dish and provides a nice texture.

Ingredients:

2 Tbsp. olive oil	1 Tbsp. smoked paprika		
1 pound boneless, skinless	1 Tbsp. cumin		
chicken thighs, cut into	2 cups chicken broth		
2-inch pieces6-ounces Kielbasa sausage,	1 cups Calrose medium		
sliced 1/8 inch thick	grain rice		
1 medium onion, chopped	1/2 teaspoon salt		
1 green bell pepper, seeded	12 shrimp, 21 – 25 cour (or large)		
and chopped	8-ounces frozen peas,		
4 cloves garlic, minced	thawed		
1 cup seeded and coarsely	1-38 ounce can sliced		

1 cup seede chopped tomatoes (about 1 pound)

unt

1-3.8 ounce can sliced black olives, drained

In a 12-inch skillet heat oil over medium high heat. When oil is hot, add chicken and cook, turning occasionally, until chicken is browned (about 5 minutes).

Add Kielbasa and cook 1 minute. Transfer chicken and kielbasa to plate. Add onion, green pepper and garlic to skillet, stir and cook 2 minutes. Add tomatoes, paprika and cumin. Cook and stir 5 minutes or until tomatoes are softened and breaking apart.

Return chicken and Kielbasa to skillet and stir. Add chicken broth, rice and salt, stir and bring to a boil.

Cover and reduce heat to low. Cook without stirring until all liquid is absorbed, and the rice is al dente, 12 to 15 minutes. (If the skillet is larger than the burner, rotate the skillet every few minutes to insure the rice cooks evenly.)

Top with shrimp and peas. Turn heat to high, and cook without stirring 1 to 2 minutes more, until shrimp are just opaque. Be careful not to overcook the shrimp as they will get tough.

Remove skillet from heat and cover with a lid or foil and let rest for 10 minutes before serving.

Serve and top with sliced olives.

Serves 4 to 6



Club Reconstruction

The board of directors recently approved the expen-



diture of up to \$4,000 to remove the rear stairs to the club as they are severely rotted. The rotting handicap ramp closest to the street was becoming a real safety hazard, which is why it needs to be demolished.

On Saturday September 18 a hearty crew of helpers and professionals including Jim Breher, Frank Paula, Sarah Ferrandini, Ted Adams, Tom Corbett, and Dodd Stange, Al's stand in, assembled to prepare the area for the contractor.

The crew remove landscape, relocated and capped the irrigation, removed PYC signage and dug out posts and cement. In addition they cleaned out under the structure items that were of no use and disposed them. The ropes were removed ropes under the railings. When they opened up the decking the extensive structural damage was revealed.

It is expected that the demo contractor will begin his work on Friday 9-24-21. Once the work is complete we will have removed a significant safety hazard and

The PYC board recently approved an increase in nonproprietary members annual fees by \$20 / year. That \$20 dollars will be sent to the Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC). Membership fees are due on November 1st. Proprietary members are encouraged to also support RBOC through a voluntary donation of at least \$20.

RBOC has been protecting boating interests since 1968 as the nonprofit advocacy organization that works to protect and enhance the interests of the state's recreational boaters before state and local government.

RBOC engages in advocacy efforts on legislation and regulations, supporting proposals that would enhance recreational boating, and opposing proposals that would have a detrimental impact on the state's three million boating enthusiasts.

The organization's advocacy efforts include testimony in public hearings, meetings with elected officials, preparation of amendments to alleviate potential problems with specific bills, as well as the sponsorship of pro-active legislation to benefit the recreational boater. RBOC also works closely in partnership with Boat U.S. on federal legislative and regulatory issues important to boaters.
