Baked Chicken and Pastina

This is an easy, do ahead casserole that will only need to be baked at the last minute, giving you time to be with your guests and enjoy your gathering. This can be prepared up to the baking stage and covered at room temperature. It can also be completely baked the day before, covered and refrigerated. Just bring to room temperature and reheat at 350° for 15 minutes. It is a flavorful comfort food your family will enjoy.

Ingredients:

8 ounces Farfalle pasta (bow tie)
2 Tablespoons olive oil
1 1/2 cups cubed chicken breast (1 inch cubes)
about 3 small breasts
1 cup diced onion
2 clove garlic, minced
1 (14.5 ounce) can diced tomatoes with juice
1 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella
1/4 cup chopped flat leaf parsley
1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup Panko bread crumbs, preferably Italian style.
1/2 cup grated fresh Parmesan Butter Sliced black olives, drained

Preheat oven to 400°.

Bring a medium pot of salted water to a boil over high heat. Add pasta and cook until just tender, stirring occasionally. Drain pasta and transfer into a large mixing bowl.

Heat olive oil in a medium skillet over medium high heat. Add chicken and cook for 3 minutes.

Add onions and garlic, stirring to combine and cook until onions are soft and chicken is cooked through.

Add chicken to pasta. Add the tomatoes with juice, mozzarella, parsley, salt and pepper and mix well. Butter a 6 x 9 inch baking dish. Place chicken mixture in baking dish.

In a small bowl combine bread crumbs and Parmesan. Sprinkle over top of chicken mixture.

Dot top with small bits of butter.

Bake until top is golden brown, about 30 minutes.

Garnish top with sliced black olives.

There is now the complete list in the club info book behind the bar in case we are visited some day by ABC agents. If you are serving alcohol, your name needs to be on this list. If you are not certified you can still be behind the bar serving soft drinks, getting ice, refilling the coolers with alcoholic bottles, cleaning up empty alcoholic bottles, etc. helping a certified bar tender serving alcohol. However, it would behoove all of us to be certified so everyone can serve themselves or others alcohol anytime in the club. The responsibility of tending bar should be club wide, not with just a few. Ok, ok, enough preaching. Signing up for tending bar should be fun. If you need help please call those of us that love doing bar and we can find a way to support you whether its making those cosmopolitans or opening on time or staying until closing. 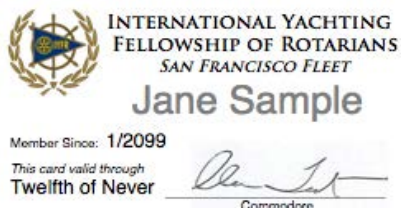

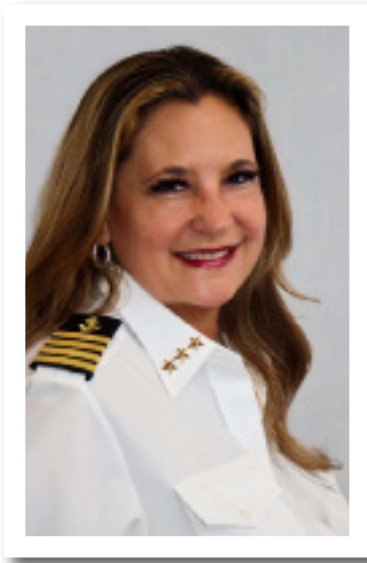
