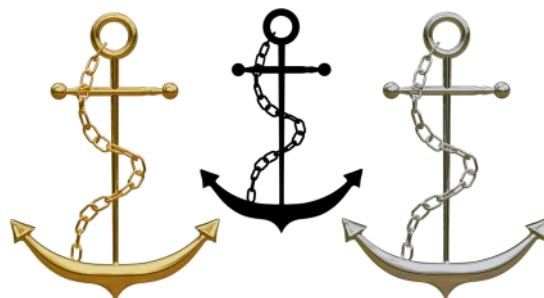

The weather was perfect as we watched the parade of beautiful boats go by our office on the Petaluma River. We could see the red, white, and blue burgees identifying this group our guests from the San Francisco Yacht Club so we went out onto our lawn to wave and welcome them to town, although I doubt they could hear us when we told them we would see them a bit later as we were the leads running bar duty at their intended destination – the Petaluma Yacht Club.

As the flotilla hovered in a long line, stretching all the way from Petaluma's historic D Street draw-bridge all the way down past the start of Steamer Landing Park, their captains and passengers appeared to be in a great mood and certainly looked like a fun crowd. The horn finally sounded that the bridge was opening, and they were on their way into the Petaluma River turning basin for a weekend of wining, dining, and relaxation, Petaluma style.

On the agenda was a homecooked brisket dinner, spearheaded by Leland Fishman and Anne Mirante, but with a heavy dose of help from a neighbor's smoker as Leland and Anne actually had something else on the calendar prior to this event and were rolling back into town this Friday afternoon just in time to expertly prepare dinner in the club's galley.

We volunteer bartenders showed up a bit early to make sure the bar was set up and ready as our afternoon preview of their parade of boats told us it was going to be a busy night. While one of us worked on completing that task, the other hopped over to Baskin Robbins to retrieve one of the two ice cream cakes made custom for this event. It was a beautiful rendition of SFYC's burgee and was just barely able to fit in our freezer, while the second, much larger cake, which was a caricature of the waterfront at SFYC, would have to be retrieved a bit closer to dinner. Once both were at the club, they were put on display and received universal ooh's and ahh's from our guests, with many wanting to take photos with the cakes prior to their cutting. The crowd was even more impressed once they learned that both cakes were actually ice cream cakes.

Once we hoisted the flags, the boats emptied with everyone flooding the bar for a happy hour drinking before sitting down to dinner. Although there were plenty of assigned PYC volunteers, this night could not have been pulled off to such perfections without all the additional members who showed up to give a helping hand, from Rosemary and Kevin Hart helping us behind the bar, to John Wolthausen and Nancy Wolf with general service help, to Sal Taormina basically being a jack of all trades. There were many other members who came and went during the evening, pitching in when they saw the need, while spending the rest of the time, simply making our guests feel welcome.

The bar stayed open rather late before everyone moseyed back down to their boats for night caps. While speaking with them at the bar, we learned that many had plans the next day to walk around and shop throughout downtown, with all of them having a big dinner reservation at Central Market. We expressed our appreciation to them because their dollars make a big difference to our downtown businesses.

When they inquired about our Saturday night bar hours, we promised them we would arrive early

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so that they could visit us again for a drink before heading out for dinner, and that as long as they did not return too late, we would hang out, just in case they wanted another drink or two before turning in for the night.

Sure enough, as soon as we raised the flags on Saturday evening and waived hello to our guests, they asked if it was okay to come up to the bar. They were extremely polite, as they were all weekend, and offered to wait until we were fully ready for them, but we told them they were welcome just as soon as they were thirsty, which had them all flooding the bar in a hurry once again. They said they would return from dinner in about two hours, but we thought that was unlikely with the way these folks like to visit with each other, so after a couple of hours since their departure, started cleaning up the bar and closing things down, like normal.

However, true to their word, the group roll back in just in time to catch us, and again were extremely polite and told us to kick them out whenever we wanted to head home. Even with an early morning ahead of us, we kept things going for another couple of hours because they were such an enjoyable group to serve, visit with, and get to know better.

At one point our internet music was not quite cutting it for them, so we got the jukebox fired up, which led to some dancing, which really seemed to make them happy. And because the jukebox did not appear to be charging them, they insisted on throwing extra money into our Building Maintenance tip jar. One of their members even noticed our disco ball, which we personally have never turned on before, but with the help of Sal, got it up and running for a half hour or so to help them close out their evening in style.

The SFYC members were clearly thrilled with our great dinner service, affordable drinks, and friendly and welcoming bar "staff" because as soon as one tab had been used up, another member offered to cover the next \$100 or \$200 worth of drinks. This actually made it much easier to keep the drinks flowing without a lot of breaks visiting the cash register. We simply wrote the dollar amount on the board and then tallied up the drinks as we went along. They had graciously done this on Friday night for all our volunteers and repeated their generosity on Saturday night too. And those that were paying for their individual drinks were often throwing the remainder of their change from their fives, tens, and even twenties into our Building Fund tip jar. At the same time, they were all acting quite responsibly, with us only having to cut off a couple of guests, but both accepted our decision with no fuss and gladly accepted the glass of ice water we offered them, gratis, of course. They were quite impressed with the fact that we are all volunteer bartenders and understand the importance to us that we could not risk our ABC license in any way.

All in all, this was the most bar work we have ever completed in a weekend since becoming members but was also the most gratifying. Several of our guests even inquired about becoming members, which we pushed enthusiastically, especially because these would be boat owning members. This may have simply been their drinks talking, but either way, the visiting San Francisco Yacht Club could not stop thanking all of us for our Petaluma hospitality and said they could not wait to return.

From Tom's Galley

Chevre with Honey, Thyme, Chives and Rosemary Spread



Ingredients:

25 – 30 slices from a small baguette, about ¼ inch thick, or with a 2-inch circle cutter cut slices of sourdough bread into circles (as shown)

Buttery spray flavor

7-ounces cream cheese

2 – 5 ounce Chevre with Honey (goat milk cheese) at room temperature. Available at Trader Joe's.

1/4 cup thinly sliced fresh chives, plus more for garnish

1 tablespoon fresh thyme leaves

1 tablespoon fresh rosemary leaves, chopped

Salt and ground pepper to taste

Sliced black olives, drained

Preheat oven broiler to 500°.

Place baguette slices on baking sheet and spray with buttery spray. Broil in oven until lightly browned on top side. Watch carefully as they will brown quickly. Let cool to room temperature.

Place cream cheese in a food processor and process, scraping down sides, until cheese is smooth and creamy.

Break goat cheese into chunks with a fork and add to cream cheese. Process until mixture is smooth.

Add chives, thyme and rosemary leaves and process until herbs are finely ground.

Season to taste with salt and freshly ground pepper and process.

Spread on baguette slices. (or pipe onto baguettes with a pastry bag)

Sprinkle with chopped chives and top with an olive slice.

This spread will keep up to a week covered and refrigerated. Bring to room temperature if piping.

Serves 10 - 12

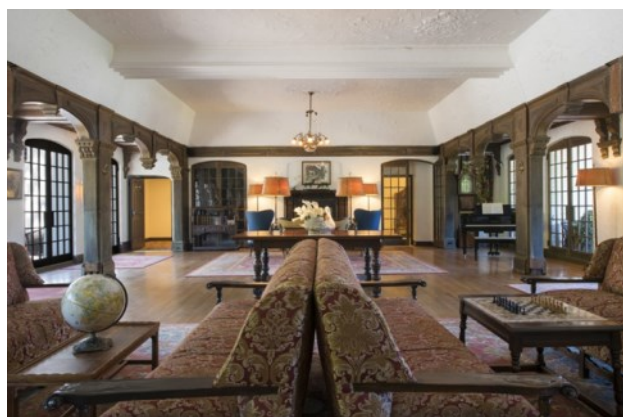

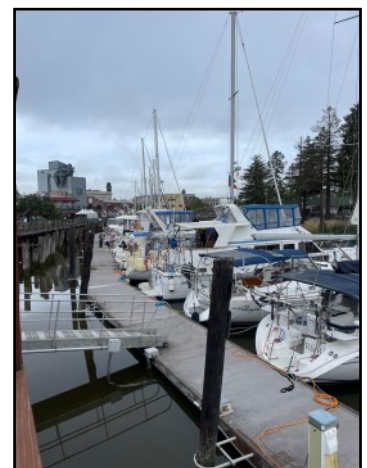
Our last big event—Memorial Day Weekend

PYC Bar Certification Status Report

It has been 1 ½ years now since California Responsible Beverage Service has been in effect.

Significantly, 88 club members have done the roughly 2-hour online training program and taken the California State RBS test for Alcoholic Service Certification successfully. Unfortunately, this is not enough members to cover bar duty for the year as required in your membership by-laws. All who are certified are not on this list.

This means the 56 members listed here are in jeopardy of being non-compliant for maintaining their current membership status. The exception, as noted in **RED**, are those who have been approved by the VCO to be excused as granted in our rules.

Couples having 1 non-certified partner **CAN TEND BAR** (certified member would be the bartender and non-certified partner the bar backup)! As an example, I am certified, and my spouse, Janny, has tended bar as my backup. So, both partners do not have to be certified.

The 2 requirements non-certified members **MUST FOLLOW** as a bar backup person are:

1. **DO NOT SERVE ALCOHOLIC DRINKS!**
2. **THEY CAN NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CHECKING ID'S or LEVELS OF INEBRIATION!**

(Because they have not taken the training on ways to check fake ID's or inebriated entrants).

For example, they cannot be at the front door checking ID's **OR DRUNKENNESS** as we do with big events like the lighted boat parade, memorial day, etc.

Non-certified members can "handle" alcoholic drinks, i.e. stock cooler/back bar with beer, wine, ice, etc. They can do the cash register with the customer's cash, cc, etc. They can do everything else except the 2 things above.

If you are a single member, maybe you want to partner with another single member and have one get certified and do bar duty as a couple.

I am happy to help and guide anyone who wants to get certified. Just email me!!
