From Tom's Galley

The flavors of the marinated, roasted Portabella mushroom with the shrimp and blue cheese create a very nice pairing. The stems of the mushrooms can be removed by twisting them gently from side to side. Be careful when removing the gills that you do not damage the sides of the mushrooms.

Shrimp Stuffed Portabella Mushrooms.

Ingredients:

1 1/2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil

4 large Portabella mushrooms

1/2 cup Italian-style salad dressing

1/2 pound 21 – 25 count shrimp

1 tablespoon minced garlic

1/2 cup finely diced onion

1 1/2 tablespoons chopped flat leaf parsley

2 tablespoons butter

3/4 cup seasoned Panko bread crumbs

1/2 cup crumbled gorgonzola (or Blue) cheese

1 tablespoon Italian herb seasoning

Kosher salt and pepper to taste



Preheat oven to 400°.

Grease a 9x13-inch baking sheet pan with 1 1/2 tablespoons of olive oil.

Lightly brush mushrooms to remove any dirt.

Separate stems from cap and reserve. With a small spoon scoop out the dark mushroom gills, discard gills.

Finely chop mushroom stems and set aside.

Place mushroom caps in a zip-lock bag, add Italian dressing and marinate 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, peel shrimp, cut in half lengthwise and set aside. Mince garlic, dice onion, chop parsley, set aside.

Melt 2 tablespoons butter in a skillet over medium heat for a few minutes.

Add garlic, diced onion and chopped mushroom stems and cook, stirring constantly, for 3-4 minutes.

Remove from heat. Add panko, gorgonzola cheese, Italian herd seasoning and parsley.

Mix to combine and salt and pepper to taste.

Fill mushroom caps with mixture and place in the prepared sheet pan.

Bake in preheated oven 15 to 20 minutes.

Sprinkle top with a little crumbled gorgonzola and serve.

Serves 4

Our vacation month in Leland, Michigan which is a large harbor on the western shores of Lake Michigan, By: Linda Lockwood & Stacy Horton



IYBTYK - If You've Been There You Know! Leland, Michigan sits on the western shore of the "Little Finger" of the lower peninsula of Michigan - the Mitten State. It is a Boat Lovers destination on the Great Lakes. Situated about two-thirds of the way up Lake Michigan - (measuring from Chicago to The Straits of Mackinaw - 400+/- nautical miles.) Leland is a picturesque, coastal small town located on a sliver of land between Lake Michigan and Lake Leelanau, on Michigan's Leelanau Peninsula.

Traditionally Leland is known as a historic fishing village showcasing a downtown filled with local art galleries, ice cream parlors, smoked fish and cheese shops and many rock and specialty shops. The original Fishtown shanties (which are still there) offer the best fresh smoked whitefish, perch, and bass around, all in the backdrop of a crystal blue waterfall cascading from Leland River replenishing the BIG Lake aka Lake Michigan. Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore is a short jaunt down the iconic M-22 Michigan Highway.

We spent the month of August "Up North" as Michiganders say -- sailing, rock hunting, biking, ice creaming, and working on/enjoying our Leland cottage while navigating a large number of family and friends. We sailed the Manitou Passage (between Leland and North & South Manitou Islands) when 15-18 knots welcomed us and paddle-boarded the coastline searching for Petoskey stones (Michigan's state stone) when calmer waters prevailed. Wineries and eateries were aplenty - and

recommendations are available upon request



This "Little Finger" of the "Michigan Mitten" is a summer & fall destination. It offers, cruising by sail or power, water skiing, Petoskey stone hunting, cherry picking, sand dune climbing, color touring, and... in the last 40 years the region has emerged as a wine aficionado's destination. Yep, Michigan is a grape-growing state. Believe it or not, Michigan wineries, along the 45th parallel (which literally cuts through the "Little Finger"), share the distinction with many notable winemaking regions, including part of France's Burgundy & Bordeaux, Italy's Piedmont, and Oregon's Willamette Valley.

This little piece of paradise is worth the visit via water or land if the Great Lakes are on your adventure plan.

On water, cruising north from Leland is recommended. (If ever considering, one can charter boats in Traverse City.) Awaiting you are the harbors of Northport, Charlevoix, Petoskey, Harbor Springs, the Straits of Mackinaw, (demarcation between Lake Michigan & Lake Huron,) Mackinac Island, and onto the North Channel (part of Ontario, Canada). The pristine waters of the North Channel are where all the locals go summer after summer to get away from it all! (Sites to see in the North Channel will have to wait for a future newsletter)

On land, one flies into Traverse City, Michigan (where Linda grew up) to find Leland 40 minutes north. The broader area offers the National Cherry Festival in July and multiple art and music festivals and the unrivaled Interlochen Center for the Arts, Academy & Camp - featuring music,

theater & art offerings all summer long. We took in "Train" this summer.

Thank you, PYC, for indulging us in all things Northern Michigan. "If You've Been There You Know" that Lake Life is a thing - a relaxing breath of fresh air (and freshwater) like no other and if you haven't been you might consider planning a visit.

Fun Facts:

- Michigan has the longest shoreline of the United States bordering roughly 3,288 miles. One is never more than 6 miles from a body of water or 85 miles from Great Lake in the state of Michigan.
- As noted by Recreational Boats & Yachts; Boats & Yachts per 1,000 people Michigan ranks 5th with 77,996 behind only, MN, SC, WI, & ME. (CA is 46th with 16,337)
- Distribution of Recreational Boat Registrations by State: Michigan ranks 3rd behind, Florida & Minnesota. (California is 4th)
